They had been searching for a situation linked to a current and real-world business event regarding

The students identified a current issue out of Kenly, NC, which made national news (CNN, FoxNews, and other media outlets) when the town's all-white police force quit over their newly-hired boss, Town Manager Ms. Justine Jones, a Black female. Ms. Jones was ultimately fired by a 3-2 vote where the three individuals

who voted to fire her were White, and the two who voted to retain her were

The saga continued when the Spring Lake Board and Mayor hired Ms. Jones with a start date of October 24, 2022. The White State Treasurer unilaterally reversed that decision. The students

contacted Mayor Anthony, and she agreed to come and discuss the situation.

with the mayor. The business students were beyond thrilled! Many

commented that they never thought a mayor involved in a national news story regarding social justice would respond to their request. They were able to experience social justice in action.

> Just as our Shaw students were brave enough to press an issue of such magnitude and have the courage to extend the invitation, so was the Honorable Mayor moved to respond to their call to action by driving more than an hour to discuss the social

justice implications of Ms. Jones' case. Students talked about the impact of her visit for weeks. Several expressed that they were touched and transformed by the interaction.

Students Represent Shaw U at Florida Entrepreneurship Conference




NC IDEA Awards \$150K to Shaw's **Entrepreneurship Program**

For the second consecutive year, the School of Business and Professional Studies operated a Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) site, providing tax services for faculty, staff and students. VITA is an IRS-sponsored program that offers free income tax preparation/assistance to taxpayers whose gross income is \$60,000 a year or less. All tax preparers must pass an IRS certification test. During our Federal Income Tax Accounting course, at least 80% of the students completed the semester as certified IRS VITA tax preparers.

\$5 MILLION NTIA GRANT TO POWER SHAW TECHNOLOGY

n February 2023, Shaw University received a \$5 million financial assistance award from the National Telecommunications & Information Administration's (NTIA) National Institute of Standards and Technology fund for its Building Bridges to CODE (Cyber Operations & Digital Equity) program. The grant funds awarded to Shaw will be used to:

- · Fund outreach and research activities for the Center for Cybersecurity Education and Research; and expand the number of faculty in computer science to grow the Cyber Operations program;
- Purchase computer equipment to offer

students virtual hardware for use throughout the Cyber Operations degree program, which was launched in fall 2022;

- Purchase computer equipment to establish a research and study lab; and
- Support undergraduate researchers to participate in cybersecurity-related

Dr. James Brown, director of the Center for Cybersecurity Education and Research, said, "This grant will support our Cyber Security academic program, our IT infrastructure, smart classrooms, as well as student technology." Joel Faison, Shaw's

Chief Information Officer, said the grant funds will enable the university to: 1) execute a complete overhaul of outdated broadband infrastructure and to provide campus-wide Wi-Fi 6 wireless access; 2) provide digital devices and technology to low-income and under-resourced students attending the university; 3) upgrade classroom technology to allow for brickand-mortar and virtual classes to occur simultaneously; 4) expand the remote educational adult degree program; and 5) fully implement the first HBCU Cyber Operations degree program in the nation.

Bears Visit Lexis Nexis

Sixteen Shaw University students had the opportunity to participate in a site visit to Lexis Nexis, a global company focused on digitizing judicial proceedings to increase access and transparency in over 150 countries. During the visit, students heard from experts at various career stages and gained insight into their day-to-day responsibilities. They also networked with global leaders and toured the campus.

Cyber Operations Receives NSF Grant

Dr. James Brown and Dr. Robert Holland were awarded the NSF HBCU-UP Catalyst Award titled Increasing Inclusiveness and Access to Cybersecurity through Lab Experiences. This award granted \$200k to establish a Security Operations Center (SOC) lab. The lab will provide an isolated environment with hardware and software to be used as part of the B.S. Computer Science, Cyber Operations concentration. The Cyber Operations concentration focuses on preparing students for successful offensive cybersecurity careers by teaching advanced networking, ethical hacking, and malware analysis skills.

Red Hat Hosts Shaw Students for **Exclusive Hackathon Session**

Six Shaw University students participated in the first ever Red Hat Hackathon. In preparation for the hackathon, students participated in three hands-on trainings led by leading industry experts. The hackathon provided students the opportunity to engage and collaborate with senior software engineers to contribute to an interactive GIF-based open source project.
